Good Friday Activities and Ideas

Choose some or none! It's whatever your family would like to do.

Heavy Cross

- You will need: Any item around your house
- Is it heavier or lighter than the cross?
- Things to think about: Do you think it was easy carrying the cross?

- Step 1:Look around your house for different items
- Step 2: Point out the items you think are lighter than the cross (Pick them up if you can)
- Step 3: Point out the items you think are heavier than the cross (Do you think you can pick them up?)





Retelling the Story

- What you will need: Different toys from around the house, bible
- You only need to pick one of the gospels to go through
- Bible references: Matthew 26: 36 to end and Matthew 27: 11 - 61, Mark 14: 32 to end and Mark 15, Luke 22: 39 to end and Luke 23, John 18 and 19
- Key Roles: Jesus, Peter, Judas, Caiaphas, Pontius Pilate
- Extra Roles: James, John, armed guards, chief priests, the crowd, Barabbas, soldiers, Pilate's wife, Simon, two rebels, Joseph (owner of the tomb)
- Things to think about: How do you think Jesus felt? What do you find hard about this story?

- Step 1: Using the bible and the previous slide, identify the key characters in the Good Friday story
- Step 2: Assign different roles from the Good Friday story to each toy. If you don't have enough toys, get creative!
- Step 3: Read the story and act it out with your toys







Pontius Pilate

Feeling Rubbish

- You will need: Clean piece of rubbish, something to write with
- Things to think about: Why did Jesus die on the cross?

- Step 1: Get a clean piece of rubbish
- Step 2: On your bit of rubbish, write down something that you've done wrong and want to ask God for forgiveness for
- Step 3: Say a prayer asking God for forgiveness
- Step 4: Place your bit of rubbish in the appropriate bin when you have finished







Tin Foil Cross

- You will need: Foil, paper or card, scissors, glue or tape something to write/draw with
- Things to think about: What do you find encouraging about the cross?

- Step 1: Cut out some tin foil into the shape of the cross (the same size as your paper/card cross)
- Step 2: Stick the foil cross onto a piece of paper/card
- Step 3: Cut around your tin cross
- Step 4: Write down or draw some encouragements onto your cross



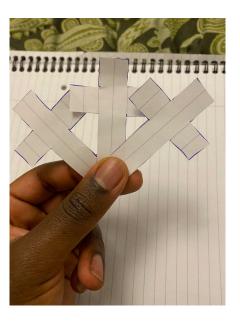


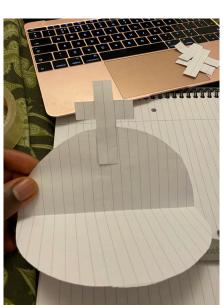


The Cross on the Mound

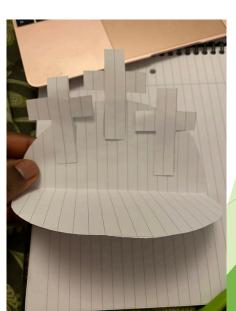
- You will need: Paper, glue or tape, scissors (optional: paper plate, colouring pens)
- Things to think about: What does forgiveness look like

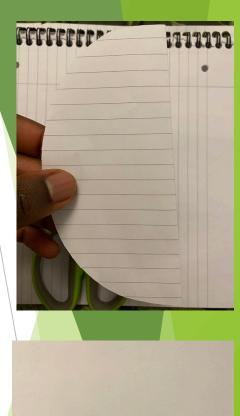
- Step 1:Cut out three crosses. Colour in the crosses brown if you wish
- Step 2: Cut out a circle big enough to stick the crosses on. Colour it in green if you wish
- Step 3: Fold the circle in half
- Step 4: Stick one cross on the top half of the circle, placing it central and towards the top
- Step 5: Stick the other two crosses either side of the first cross, but lower down than it
- Step 6: Stick the bottom half of the circle onto another piece of paper or paper plate

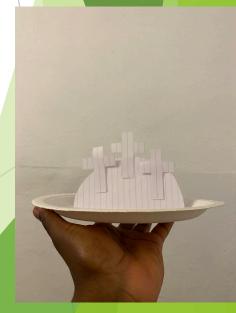












Frank
