

# THE ROAD TO EMMAUS

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LUKE 24: 13 - 35



# WHAT YOU WILL NEED

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- Bible (Physical or on the internet)
- Pens
- Paper

# GAME: HANGMAN

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- Write up a word or phrase using dashes to represent the amount of letters.
- If someone guesses the word or phrase correctly then they can write up the next word or phrase.
- Keep going for as long as you like

# WAS IT REALLY HIM?

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- Ask:
- If they had had the experience of meeting someone they haven't seen for a long while
- Did they worry about whether they would recognise them?
- How was it when they saw them face to face?
- Had they changed at all?
- How long did it take before they seemed really familiar again?

# WAS IT REALLY HIM?

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- Read Luke 24:13-35 together
- As a family, dramatize Luke's account of the road to Emmaus. Start from the moment that they realise that the person is Jesus. However, you can start from the beginning of the passage
- Ask them to focus on how the two friends must have felt when they realised that it was Jesus they had been spending time with. What did they say to each other as they hurried back to Jerusalem to tell the other friends of Jesus what they had experience?
- Discuss together what effect this encounter with the risen Jesus must have had on the two friends. How did it change their lives?

# PRAYER ACTIVITY

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- Ask the young people to imagine that they had been in the house at Emmaus as Jesus broke the bread. All of a sudden they realise that Jesus really is alive and is in their house, sharing a meal with them. What question would they like to ask Him?
- After they have had a few minutes to think, ask them to share their questions.
- Explain that because of who Jesus is, because He really did rise from the dead, then they can ask Him their questions.
- Get them to ask Jesus their questions in a prayer
